A sign, at the entrance to the village, informs us that we have arrived on the "Tetto della Valle Imagna", Fuipiano, at 1019 m. above sea level, is the last village in the valley, a quiet place, a starting point for interesting hikes through woods and well-tended meadows, along the ridges between the Brembilla and Taleggio Valleys, on the panoramic Costa del Pallio that leads towards Resegone. The hamlet of Arnosto, with its original, well-preserved rustic buildings typical of the Imagna and Taleggio Valleys, is well worth a visit.



Here, on a widening to the left, you can park.



We begin our route near the aqueduct building, which can be reached by passing through the main square of the village and taking, on the right, Via Milano, which must be climbed up to where the asphalt road ends.



Following the dirt road, after about ten minutes, at a crossroads, we must go right (C.A.I. 579 A signpost for the "Tre Faggi" (Three Beeches), passing a beautiful wooden crucifix.



We continue on the path in a series of ups and downs among the beeches.



As the ascent continues, the beech trees gradually thin out.



The road is now unpaved, but easy and allows us to look down into the valley.



We arrive on a small plateau, behind a house, where the path starts that will allow us to reach our destination. We continue to the left on the dirt road, keeping to the left at the next fork as well.




We reach our destination with a small fenced altar.



Here are the 'Three Beeches' near a waterhole. The return route will be identical to that of the outward journey; we will have to be careful, but this will not distract us from admiring the splendid panorama, which is also favoured by the beautiful day. As we continue our descent, we see again the places of the outward journey, which we may have overlooked due to the effort involved in the ascent.
