

The car park is on the road just above the village of Oneta, a locality that tradition identifies as the birthplace of Harlequin. The view of the village, a handful of houses that, although restored, have retained their original medieval appearance and characteristics, invites you to take a break.



We follow the directions of the arrow.



Small car park.



On reaching the small square below, we encounter the 15th-century stately building known as "Harlequin's House".



We reach the little church of the Carmine on whose outer wall a large Saint Christopher, along with other saints, protected travellers travelling along the Via Mercatorum, the oldest road in the Brembana Valley.



Continuing on to the village of Oneta we encounter a typical local house.



The hike begins at the little church and follows the stretch of the Via Mercatorum that from Oneta reaches Cornello dei Tasso, in the first section with its paving stones.



Continuing on, the path is almost all with wooden barriers and immersed in the woods.



Some sections of the path have minimal gradients but a mixed surface with uneven stretches.



We come in sight of a small bridge and cross it.



We reach, on the left side of the path, the Oratory of Sant'Anna, where we are about halfway along the route.



At the Oratory we encounter a marker post.



We now arrive at a Santella near Cornello dei Tasso.



Final section before the short ascent to the village, the road surface is considerably uneven.



Care must be taken in this part of the route in case of rain, water or snow on the ground.



We now pass a section with a makeshift arrangement of the path.



We arrive at the final climb with steps.



We reach Cornello dei Tasso and admire various views of the village.



We admire the houses set in the panorama of the village.



There are houses typical of the area.



We see well-preserved remains of the station of the old postal service.




We arrive in front of the well-preserved Church of Saints Cornelius and Cyprian.
