

From Monte di Nese to the Baita G.A.P. and to Salmezza

From Nese, a hamlet of Alzano Lombardo, the carriage road climbs the valley, touching on the hamlets of Büsa and Burro and, having reached the hamlet of Monte di Nese, continues as far as the houses of Castello, where it ends.



Parking is available in the small square, which opens out panoramically onto the Alzano basin.



A sign indicates the start of the route to the Baita G.A.P., the small refuge of the Gruppo Alpino Paleocapa di Nese (Pietro Paleocapa, an illustrious engineer and politician born in Nese in 1788).



We resume our walk, following the signposts on CAI path 533.



We now walk along the path, which is fairly compact.



At the crossroads, we continue keeping to the right.



The signpost indicates that we are 20' from the Baita G.A.P.



At the crossroads, we turn left, following the signposts.



We reach a further fork with a signpost indicating Baita G.A.P. and take the path to the left.



We continue following the blue signs.



We reach the Baita G.A.P. now sold to a private individual.



The hut presents itself as a solid and compact structure.



We turn back a few metres and take the path to Salmezza indicated with blue signs.



We take up the path again and meet a signpost indicating the direction to Salmezza.



After a few minutes the path rejoins path 533 and the signs, from now on, will be of two types, red white and blue.



On the route we now pass a section with some rocky outcrops.



A signpost is placed on a signpost indicating the direction to Salmezza.



We now have to overcome a short, stepped section.



Continuing along the path, we leave the forest and reach a farmhouse.



The route now runs along a stretch fenced off by hedges.



The ground is now easily passable.



Although the path is quite narrow, walking along it is pleasant because we are only a few minutes from our destination.



Following the directions of the last signpost, we are about to reach Salmezza.



Now, having finally arrived, we admire the houses of Salmezza, lying on green meadows.

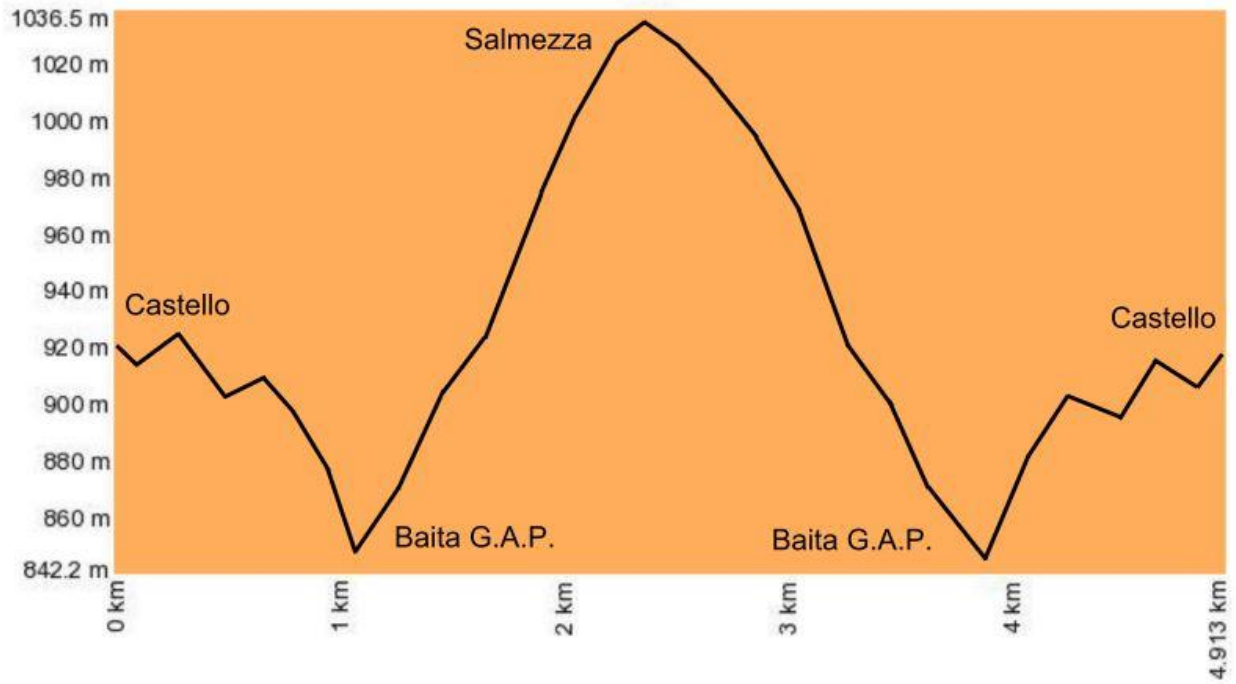


In the background we see the little church of Salmezza.
