Having parked the car near the Clanezzo cemetery, we begin our ascent in the direction of Monte Ubione.



The indicator pole informs us of the time it will take to reach our destination, following CAI path 571.



The group today is large, consisting of C.A.I. volunteers from the Gruppo Montagna per Tutti - Filippo Ubiali and volunteers from the Imagna Valley A.I.D.O. association.



The path climbs with consecutive hairpin bends that take us to higher altitudes.



At the first fork, we keep to the right.



We enter the dense forest, also following the signs on the trees.



The section becomes more and more demanding.



The signpost we encounter informs us that we are walking along the Partisan Path.



At the next fork, we keep to the left and continue the ascent, which now becomes more peaceful.



We come out of the wood and find ourselves in a meadowy widening; we turn right and continue along the marked path.



On our ascent we also encounter a wooden crucifix.



We have now arrived, after the last uphill stretch at the summit of Mount Ubione.




On the summit there is an area equipped with tables and benches suitable for resting and a small snack.



Above us towers the large pylon in the shape of a cross. After resting sufficiently, we resume our descent following the same route as the ascent, taking particular care not to slip unnecessarily.
