Starting from Bergamo, we follow the SS 671, turn right in the direction of Gandino where we purchase the 'Gratta e parcheggio' (scratch and park), then continue towards Peia and at the roundabout turn right in the direction of Valle Piana, until we reach the car park near the Malga Lunga. Purchase the "Gratta e parcheggio" (scratch card) to display on the car, at the Bar Sport near Campo Sportivo di Gandino. After parking near the Malga Lunga (500 m. from the same), we begin to climb along the asphalted road in the direction of the malga. We reach a crossroads with an information sign indicating the direction for our destination.



After parking near the Malga Lunga refuge, we start the route to Campo d'Avene.



We retrace our steps until we come to a fork in the road and, following the signposts, walk towards our destination.



A second signpost confirms that we are on the right path.



We continue on a somewhat steep climb, on CAI path 545 with a dirt surface.



We now reach a compact section of the route.



It is a fairly wide path that climbs with a good gradient in this first section.



Along the way we come across the stump of a cut tree, with a prayer written on it.



After a short stretch we reach the "Crus" puddle (1250 m).



We now reach a small lake.



We finally reach our destination of the "Campo d'Avena" (1249 m.).



The lawn is very large and pleasantly green.



Here we find a beautiful, very welcoming refreshment point, with a large hut used as a farm run by the Persico family.



It is possible to shop for 0 km products.

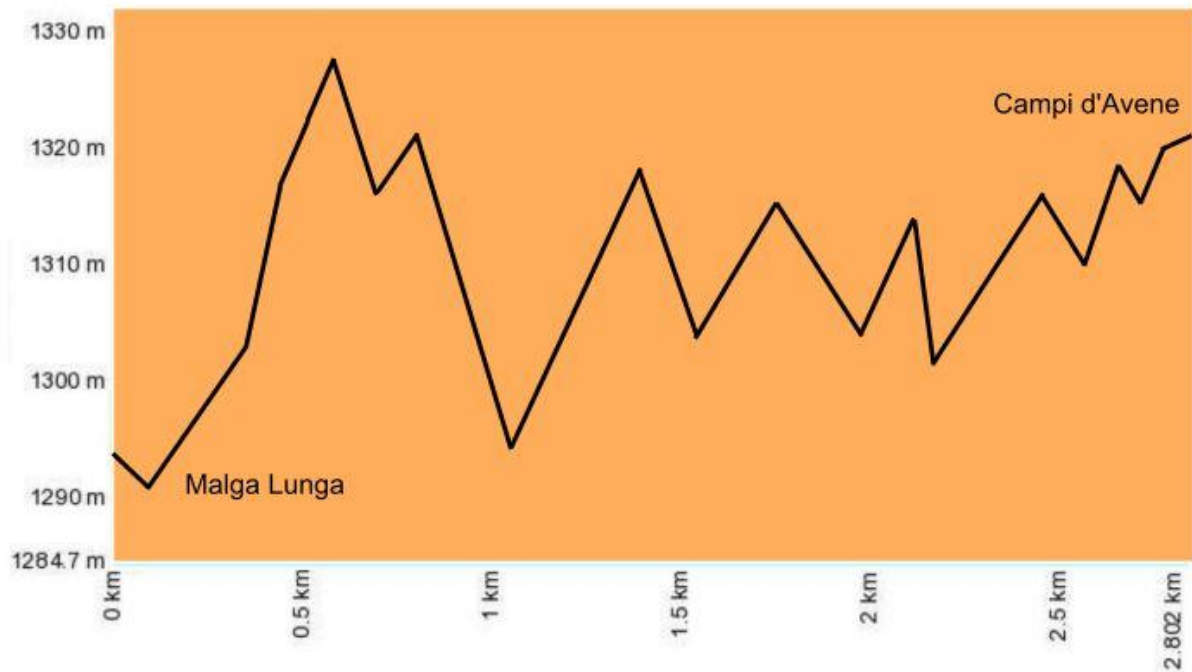


The symbol we find confirms that we are on the C.A.I. path, which cheers us up.
