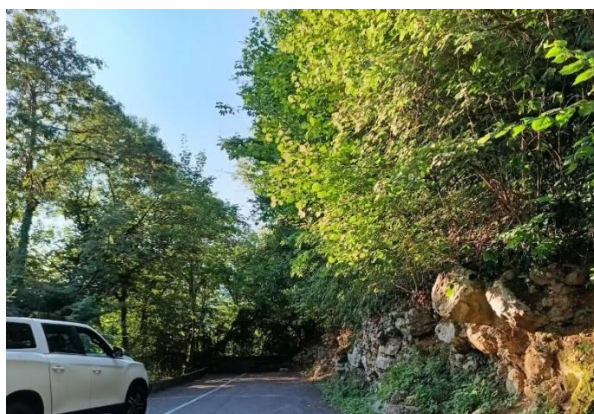

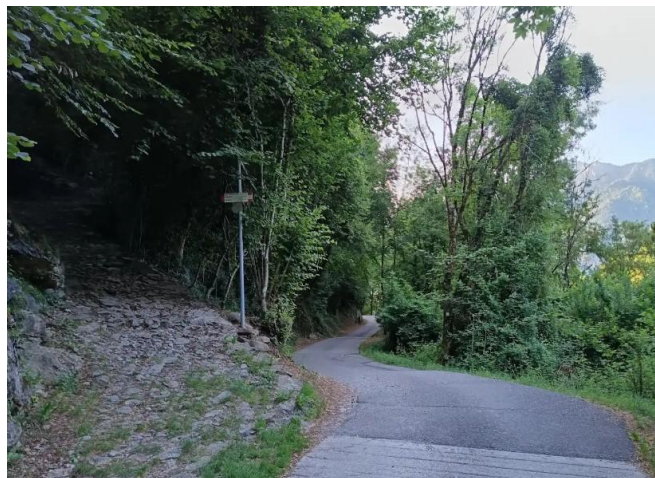
After parking the car, we begin our hike toward Monte Alino.



To the left of the trash compactors, we start walking downhill along the paved road.



Now the road is decidedly uphill, interspersed with slightly level sections.



At the junction with the mule trail on the left (CAI Trail 241), we decide to continue along the road.



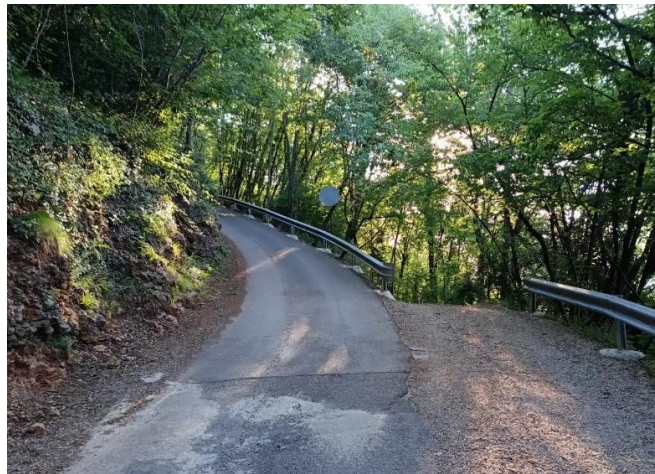
At the first fork we come to, we continue uphill to the left.



At the second fork, we keep to the left.



On the left side of the road, we come to a votive niche.



We continue straight ahead and uphill at the third fork, staying on the paved road.



We reach and easily pass the first hairpin turn to the left.



Continuing on, we reach the second hairpin turn to the right.



In a pen on the steep meadow to the left, we see some small goats.



We reach the third hairpin turn, which turns to the left.



Continuing on, we arrive at the fourth hairpin turn, which turns to the right.



On the meadow near the trees, we see a small flock of sheep.



Continuing along the road, we reach the fifth hairpin turn, which turns left.



We stay to the right and continue uphill at the fork we've reached.



On the left side, there's a signpost indicating different destinations; we continue on (CAI Trail 141).



When we reach the fork, we keep to the right on the paved road.



In the distance, we can see our destination on the right side of the road.



We have reached the church of Sant'Antonio Abate, the destination of our hike.



We admire how well-maintained the church building is.



Up the slope on the left is the church caretaker's house.



From the small rest area, we can see Mount Vaccaro in the distance.

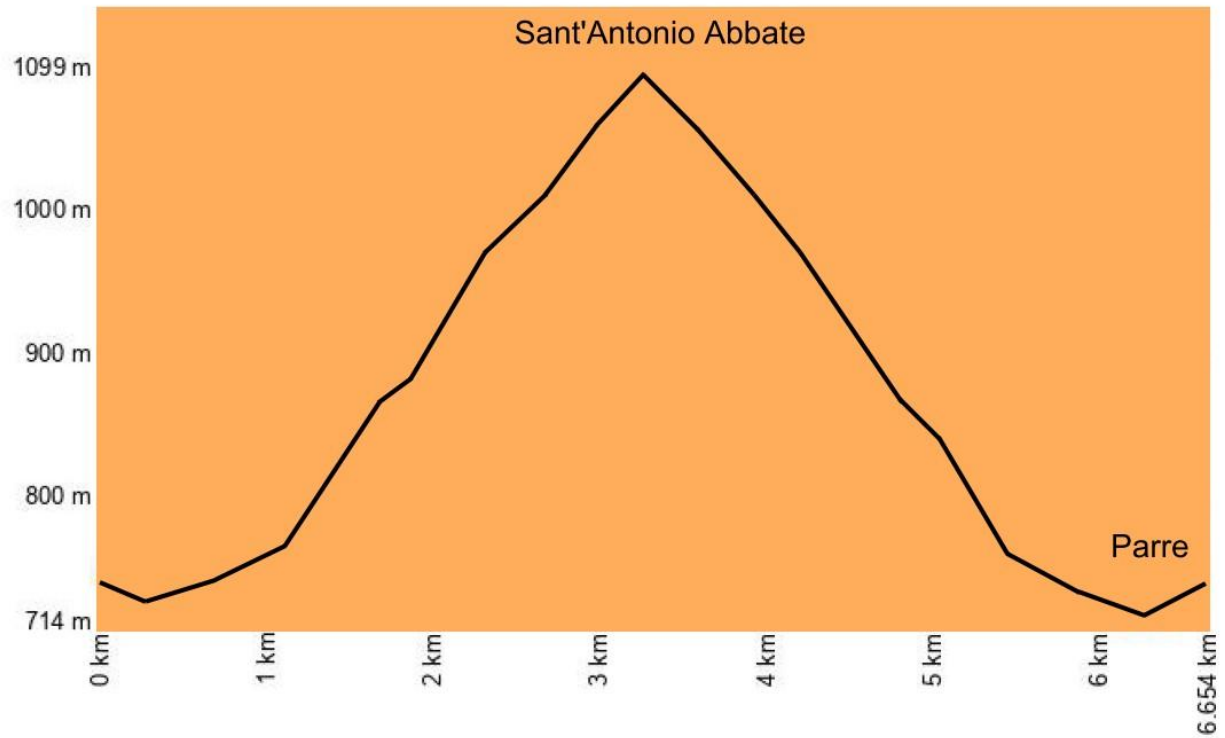


On the meadow to the north, about 300 m away, there is a giant green bench.
